Target Practice

You could make your own monster tunnel, like this idea from from Alistair Bryce-Clegg's website https://abcdoes.com/home-learning

- Find a Box
- Cut some different size holes in the side
- Decorate the holes to look like monsters
- Roll a ball can you get it into the monster's mouth?
- Maybe you could give each hole a number and keep score!





You can have great fun trying to roll a ball into the different holes. If you haven't got a big box, you could use a few small boxes instead.

You could use old bottles or tins to make a skittles game, or balance balls on top of cardboard tubes and then see if you can knock them off.




Boxes are brilliant for making things with. A big box can be a house, a castle or a train.


Story of the Week

This week's story is about a boy who makes a house out of a box. It's a great story to help children think about sharing.


